<p>Summary of spending and actions taken for 2015-16 academic year:</p> <p>To support the ongoing implementation of the International Primary Curriculum (IPC). IPC provides a stimulating curriculum helping motivate all children to learn and also to gain an understanding of their role within the global society.</p> <p>Funding of teaching assistant time to support children in receipt of PPG.</p> <p>The purchase of additional ICT resources and its supporting infrastructure so that children can be provided with individual learning programmes at home and school.</p> <p>Purchase of online Learning Platforms to help children achieve their learning targets and to provide individualised learning support for those children who require it with interventions in place in English and maths.</p> <p>Supporting parents with the provision of school uniform and where necessary other expenses e.g. school trip provision.</p> <p>Providing a wealth of outdoor learning experiences and ensuring these are accessible to all.</p>

2015 Raiseonline Data shows that children achieve good results by the end of Key Stage 2 with 100% (National Average 89%) of children in receipt of PPG achieving Level 4 and above in Reading, 100% (National Average 85%) of children in receipt of PPG achieving Level 4 and above in Writing and 100% (National Average 86%) of children in receipt of PPG achieving Level 4 and above in Maths.
