Summary of PPG spending 2014/15

Objectives in spending PPG:

To help ensure that all children regardless of need make good progress and achieve their full potential.

By the end of year 6, children in receipt of PPG will achieve a level of attainment comparable to other children in school and nationally.

Summary of spending and actions taken for 2014-15 academic year:

To support the ongoing implementation of the International Primary Curriculum (IPC). IPC provides a stimulating curriculum helping motivate all children to learn and also to gain an understanding of their role within the global society.

Funding of teaching assistant time to support children in receipt of PPG.

The purchase of additional ICT resources and its supporting infrastructure so that children can be provided with individual learning programmes at home and school.

Purchase of online Learning Platforms to help children achieve their learning targets

and to provide individualised learning support for those children who require it with interventions in place in English and maths.

Supporting parents with the provision of school uniform and where necessary other expenses eg school trip provision.

Providing a wealth of outdoor learning experiences and ensuring these are accessible to all.

Data shows that children achieve excellent results by the end of Key Stage 2 with 100% (National Average 89%) of children in receipt of PPG achieving Level 4 and above in Reading, 100% (National Average 85%) of children in receipt of PPG achieving Level 4 and above in Writing and 100% (National Average 86%) of children in receipt of PPG achieving Level 4 and above in Maths. 87.7 % combined. This is above national expectation. 100% of children achieved Level 5 in all areas.

Small cohort size means that analysing the gaps in achievement across reading, writing and maths combined between PPG and non-PPG children is meaningless. However PPG children do as well or better than non-PPG.

Planned spending and actions for 2015-16 academic year:

To continue to fund additional Teaching Assistant hours to help to support children's emotional and academic development, allowing them to continue to succeed in the classroom.

To continue to provide individualised learning support (interventions) for those children who require it in Writing, Reading and Maths.

To purchase additional ICT resources/intervention resources to support individualised learning support.
